## ADOPTION OF BOARD OF EDUCATION AGENDA:

A motion was made by <u>Cassens</u> and seconded by <u>Heldt</u> to adopt the agenda as presented. Roll call vote showed Cassens, Heeren, Heldt, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. <u>Motion carried.</u>

## **Curriculum Committee:**

The Board heard a first reading of the Curriculum Guide for 2017-18. Principal Burkholder reported that the only substantive changes are:

- Recommendations to change the Family and Consumer Science (FACS) I and II descriptions to reflect that the courses must be taken in sequence,
- A change to the descriptions for Geography I and II to reflect different topics of emphasis, and
- Changes to World History descriptions to organize the courses thematically rather than chronologically.

The Board is scheduled to approve changes to the Curriculum Guide in January.

## **Facilities Committee:**

Superintendent Hansen reported that all of the improvements mandated or recommended in the most recent 10-year Health/Life Safety survey have been completed or are scheduled.

Roll call vote showed Cassens, Heeren, Heldt, Henze, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. **Motion carried.** 

The Facilities Committee also discussed plans to continue monitoring water quality reports in Shannon as the Village completes quarterly testing as required by the Illinois EPA.

#### **Transportation Committee:**

A motion was made by <u>Heldt</u> and seconded by <u>Woessner</u> to trade-in buses #4 and #10 and to enter into a 2-year lease with <u>Midwest Transit</u> of Kankakee to lease a new 71-passenger and a new 77-passenger bus at a cost of \$21,234 per year. Roll call vote showed Cassens, Heeren, Heldt, Henze, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. **Motion carried.** 

The Committee studied the proposals received from three vendors and recommended that the District gradually move to leasing all buses as the current fleet ages out.

## **APPROVAL OF RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN:**

A motion was made by <u>Henze</u> and seconded by <u>Snider</u> to approve the tax levy for the 2017-2018 fiscal year. Roll call vote showed Cassens, Heeren, Heldt, Henze, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. <u>Motion carried.</u>

#### > APPROVAL OF HVAC BID:

A motion was made by <u>Snider</u> and seconded by <u>Heeren</u> to approve the bid from <u>Commercial</u> <u>Mechanical</u> of Dunlap, IL for Phase II of the Eastland HVAC renovation project in the amount of \$1,189,000. Roll call vote showed Cassens, Heeren, Heldt, Henze, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. <u>Motion carried.</u>
