> <u>UPDATES ON SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS:</u>

Superintendent Hansen updated the Board on approved security enhancements. Installation of shatterproof window film is substantially complete, and the installation of the BluePoint pull stations is scheduled to begin in December.

> <u>APPROVAL TO ADVERTISE FOR TRANSPORTATION BIDS:</u>

A motion was made by <u>Henze</u> and seconded by <u>Golden</u> to authorize Superintendent Hansen to advertise for bids for transportation fleet purchases for 2015-16. Bids will be sought for the trade-in of two (2) mini-buses and the purchase or lease of one (1) wheelchair accessible mini-bus and one (1) white, multi-function activity bus. > <u>APPROVAL OF REVISION TO THE DISTRICT'S RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN:</u>

> <u>APPROVAL OF TAX LEVY FOR FY16:</u>

A motion was made by <u>Golden</u> and seconded by <u>Sturtevant</u> to approve the tax levy for FY16 as presented. Roll call vote showed Golden, Heeren, Henze, Lower, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. <u>Motion carried.</u>

> **<u>DISCUSSION OF SPORTS INTEREST SURVEY:</u>**

The Board discussed the results of a Sports Interest Survey of students, and heard a recommendation from Principal Burkholder to start a new Jr. High Cross Country team beginning in 2015-16. The Board will act on this recommendation at the Regular January meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

> **<u>PROPOSED CURRICULUM CHANGES FOR FY16</u>**:

The Board heard a recommendation to expand the Summer School program to include students in the $5^{\text{th}}-6^{\text{th}}$ grades. A committee of elementary teachers chaired by Principal Feltmeyer is recommending the program to support students at-risk of retention or failure in the core areas of reading and math. Students who fit the admission criteria would attend school from 8:00 - 11:00 a.m., five days per week for four weeks. *Flex Literacy* and *Accelerated Math* would be used as competency-based curriculum for the program. Busing would be provided, and some additional costs would be incurred for transportation and pay for a staff member to facilitate the program. The Board will take action on the recommendation in January.

> <u>1ST READING OF CURRICULUM GUIDE:</u>

A first reading of the 2015-16 Curriculum Guide for Eastland Jr/Sr High School was presented by Principal Burkholder. Board action to approve the Curriculum Guide is scheduled for January. Minor changes include:

- 1. One (1) semester of computers will no longer be a requirement for high school;
- 2. The course name "Computers" will be changed to "Web 2.0;"
- 3. Removal of Advanced Web Design as a course option because it has not been offered for several years and can be taken at WACC;
- 4. Removal of American Literature II as a course option because students are now required to take a full year of American Literature.

> <u>APPROVAL TO EXTEND FOOTBALL COOPERATIVE:</u>

A motion was made by <u>Henze</u> and seconded by <u>Lower</u> to approve extending the Eastland-Pearl City High School and Jr. High Football Co-operative Agreements by one (1) year through the conclusion of the 2016 seasons. They also authorized the joint co-op committees to evaluate and present any proposed changes to the agreement for the future. Roll call vote showed Golden, Heeren, Henze, Lower, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. <u>Motion carried.</u>

> <u>APPROVAL OF FIELD TRIPS:</u>

A motion was made by <u>Lower</u> and seconded by <u>Woessner</u> to approve field trip requests for the FFA and Music programs. Roll call vote showed Golden, Heeren, Henze, Lower, Snider, Sturtevant and Woessner voting aye. <u>Motion carried.</u>

> <u>APPROVAL OF BOOSTER CLUB SPONSORSHIP:</u>

A motion was made by <u>Heeren</u> and seconded by <u>Woessner</u> to approve the request for sponsorship of a non-school youth basketball camp that will be held at Eastland Elementary School in Shannon in December and January. Voice vote showed <u>all ayes</u>.
