Federal law defines "highly qualified" teachers with reference to their certification or progress toward certification along with factors such as undergraduate major, college, or graduate degrees, and testing for subject matter and teaching skills. The law requires the District to notify parents/guardians of children in Title I schools if your child is assigned to a class being taught by, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet the federal law's definition of "highly qualified."
